Please remember to use your box number on all mail and packages. With the heavy volume that they process during the holiday season, unfortunately, we are unable to look up every article that comes in with a street address.

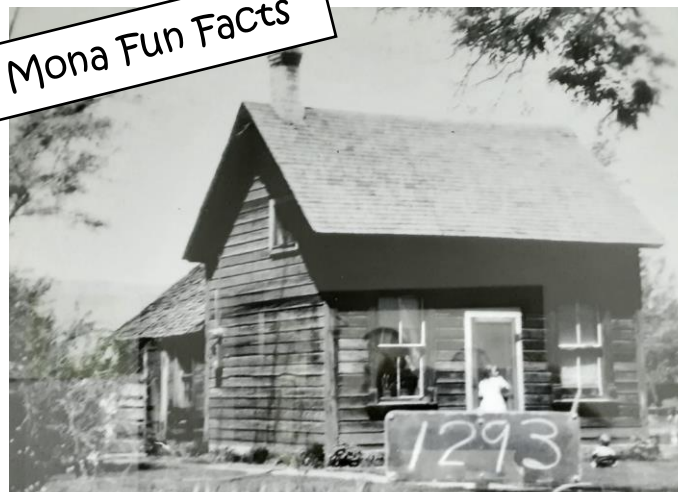

## **Why Are We Chlorinating?**

**As most of you are probably more aware than you want to be, it has been mandated by the State of Utah that we chlorinate our water. We have been very fortunate to avoid using chlorine in the past. Almost all water systems (including all of our neighboring towns and cities) have been chlorinating their water for many years. In spite of that, we recognize that this is a bit frustrating for many of you, and it has been for us as well. We are doing our best to minimize the amount of chlorine required to meet that mandate. We are required to maintain a minimum of 0.2 parts per million (ppm) throughout our system. Put another way, that is 20 cents per million dollars.**

**Because we use chlorine gas, the chlorine can be removed fairly readily. This can be done using a good water filter that includes carbon filtration. Many fridge filters will remove the chlorine. Alternately, you can put an open pitcher of water on the counter or in the fridge overnight, and the chlorine will disassociate and dissipate. You can also boil water for 15 minutes to accomplish the same objective.**
