Culinary Water Rate Increase

It was decided at the August 14th Public Hearing/Council Meeting that there was a need for a rate increase in the culinary water. The water rate increase will assist the city in meeting the objectives of the 2014 Culinary Water System Master Plan Capital Improvements Plan. This includes the remaining items for the 0- 5 years (2014 to 2019) which are the replacement of the 5-inch cast iron pipes and reconfiguration of the interconnect piping between tanks 2 and 3 at a cost of \$125,000 to \$150,000. It also includes the 5-10 year (2019 -2024) objectives of constructing a new 500,000 gallon water tank and replacing all the 4-inch and smaller pipes at a cost of \$1,500,000+. The 10-20 year (2024 - 2034) improvements are anticipated to be another \$1,115,000+. Obviously, inflation, growth rate and other factors could drive those costs higher, perhaps substantially higher. Councilman Jonathan Jones doubts costs will come in lower than anticipated. It was also decided that the allowed monthly gallons which is currently 17,500 gallons per month will be lowered to 15,000 gallons per month. The overage rate will remain the same of a \$3.00 per 1,000 gallon overage after the allowed amount. Overages will only be billed for the months April through October.

This new rate will start September 1st.

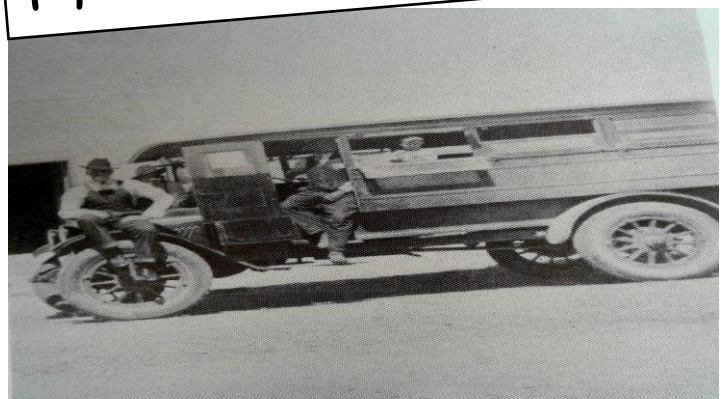

If you would like to be on the agenda, contact Sara Samuelson one week prior to the meeting. *All paperwork must be turned in two weeks in advance.*

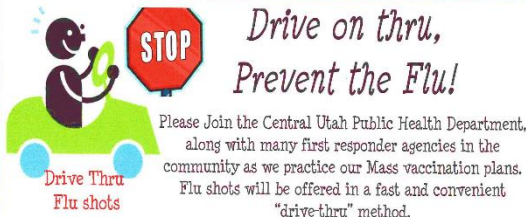
WORD FROM THE POST OFFICE

The Mona Post Office is trying to make your experience better! We are getting more PO boxes and more parcel lockers! This will make it easier for you to get your parcels and mail. Now please help us by using your PO Box number on all of your mail. We currently have over 610 PO boxes occupied (and we are still growing) and that is a lot of names and addresses to try and look up every day so it is important that we have box numbers! Please, Please, Please! You can add the box number into the zip code: 84645-0641, or with a hashtag#641 or sometimes just the number by itself by your name will work if using the phrase "P.O. Box" is rejected.

It is so helpful for us when you come and pick up your mail and especially parcels often, we don't have a lot of storage room and with the holidays coming we fill up quickly!

A few things to remember when you sell your home. If you are closing your PO Box please turn in all of your keys as soon as possible. If you are staying in Mona you can keep the same PO Box number but we only have one free PO Box per address so we need your new address. If you are leaving town but want to keep your PO Box you can do that for a fee. Don't give your PO Box keys to whomever purchases your home. The box numbers are not linked to the address and we have a system in place for closing a PO box and forwarding the mail from there. If you have any questions stop in and we will be glad to help you!
